

K. Hipolit, teacher, coach, dies

Kasimer E. Hipolit, 60, an Ithaca High School social studies instructor and former sports coach, died Sunday, August 28, 1977, at Lower Creek Road near Route 13, while on a fishing outing. Mr. Hipolit suffered an apparent heart attack.

The son of Mrs. Anna H. Hipolit of South Bound Brook, N.J., and the late Peter Hipolit, Mr. Hipolit was a Cornell University graduate who had been a member of the school's great football teams of 1938 and 1940, and the unbeaten Cornell team of 1939.

Mr. Hipolit had been a teacher at Ithaca High since September, 1947, He also served as head cross country coach and head track coach for the school teams during the 1950s and early 1960s, and had been an assistant football coach for several years.

A communicant of St. Catherine of Siena Church, he was also a World War II U.S. Navy veteran, a full lieutenant who served in the United States and North Africa. He lived at 204 Christopher Lane.

Besides his mother, Mr. Hipolit is survived by his wife, Jeannette M. Hipolit of Ithaca; two sons, John Hipolit of Philadelphia, Pa., and Richard Hipolit of Washington, D.C.; two brothers, John Hipolit of Cincinnati, Ohio, and William Hipolit of Bound Brook, N.J.; and two sisters, Mrs. Harold (Sophie) Stillwell of Bound Brook, N.J., Mrs. William (Mary) Proia of North Miami Beach, Fla.

Services will be held at 10a.m, Wednesday in St. Catherine of Siena Church, with the Rev. John Maloney officiating.

Burial will be in Pleasant Grove Cemetery.
