


Hi Margie:

This is Bob Campbell's daughter, Trish. I stopped by the Jewish Home tonight with my sister and they let us know someone had been by with a photo album for him but they

didn't know who....Did some sleuthing and came to know that it was you. :) That was so sweet of you!!!

I have some sad news to share. Dad passed away yesterday afternoon. I was there, as was my aunt (his sister, Barb) and Dad's good friend and Pastor, Alan Dailey. He went peacefully.

It was quite a shock; though the disease was progressing, we didn't think by any means that he was going to be leaving us so soon.

On top of this, my Grandmother (my Dad's mother) also passed away yesterday. She had been suffering from dementia, and had also been steadily declining for the past few months.

Dad spoke highly of you and was so appreciative of all you and his other IHS classmates did to keep him in the loop. It meant the world to him. That is why I wanted to send you a personal e-mail so that you'd have the info. We didn't get things all set until this evening. The obit will be in the Rochester, NY, paper tomorrow.

My apologies for the impersonal email. I wanted to share some sad news with you. After a difficult battle with ALS, my father, Robert Campbell, passed away yesterday. When I visited him about six weeks ago in his nursing home, it was clear the disease was accelerating, but I don't think any of us expected things to happen this quickly. On top of this, my Grandmother (my Dad's mother) also passed away yesterday. She had been suffering from dementia, and had also been steadily declining for the past few months. On some level I'm comforted that the timing of their passings coincided, but it's all still a bit much to process at this point.
